### Virginia Hunter's Championship

The Stonewall Rifle and Pistol Club invites you to compete in the **Chester Fitzgerald Memorial Virginia Hunter's Championship** at our club on **Sunday, October 21, 2012** at 10:00am till 4:00 pm, you must sign up no later than 1:00pm.

The competition will consist of a total of 30 shots at ten targets (3 shots per target): 5 @ 25yds, 3 @ 50yds, and 1 each at 75yds and 100yds.

**ALL SHOTS WILL BE SHOT OFF-HAND with exemption to youth class.**

**Any caliber, patched round ball, open sighted gun allowed.** Scoring is cutting the line.

There will be a trophy and a guaranteed **\$50** cash prize for the top shooter & a guaranteed **\$50+** cash purse divided between each of the class winners. **Scoring follows the Lewis System.**


Classes include: Men, Ladies, Juniors (15 to 17), and Youth(14 & under).

THE SHOOT DIRECTORS WILL MAKE ALL JUDGEMENTS AND RULINGS REGARDING THE SHOOTING COMPETITION. THEIR DECISIONS WILL BE FINAL.

**Explanation of the Lewis Scoring System:**

This system is based on the final scores as they are posted when the shoot has been completed and gives every contestant an equal chance to win, no matter what his or her shooting ability. When all the shooting has been completed, the scores are listed in numerical order from the highest to the lowest. They are then divided into as many groups as there are classes. For example, if there are 30 entries and 3 classes (A, B, & C), there would be 10 shooters in each class. The highest score in each class would then be the winner.
